

LOCATING PEER-REVIEWED ARTICLES

DEFINITION: Peer-review is the process by which articles are chosen to be included in a professional journal. An editorial board consisting of experts in the same field as the author reviews the article and decides if it is authoritative enough for publication. Peer reviewed journals are sometimes referred to as refereed publications.

INSTRUCTIONS: Students can locate peer-reviewed journal articles through HGTC Library's Databases as follows:

- Go to <u>www.hgtc.edu/library</u>
- Click on the Databases tab.
